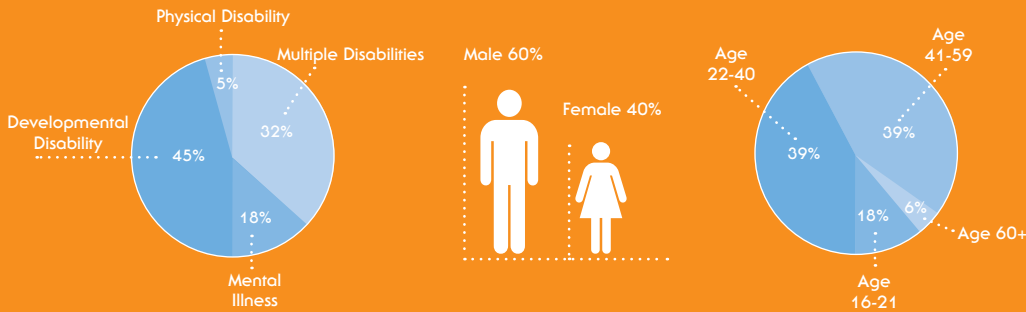

This year's event raised \$3,300 for CWTC and included a record number of teams from the following companies:

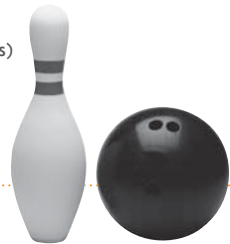
